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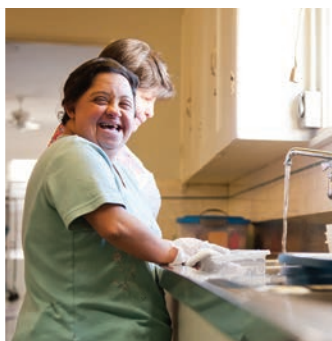
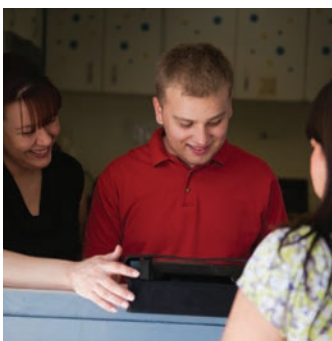

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY (all ages)

- Classroom push-in and clinic pull-out models
